Thoughts from the Congregation

ARE THERE MIRACLES?

Consider the following: Our galaxy is estimated to have 300 billion stars. These stars are estimated to have 17 billion earth-sized planets. Assuming only 0.001% of these planets have life that has evolved to sentient beings, as happened on earth, there could be 17 million such "earths" in our galaxy alone.

The total number of humans that have lived on earth is estimated to be 108 billion. Assuming 17 million possible other earths, nearly 1,840,000,000,000,000,000 someones may have existed in just our galaxy. Multiply that number by 200 billion for all the galaxies we can see and the fact that you or I exist seems rather unlikely.

If the Big Bang Theory is correct, all this started at a point in time and space at which there was no time or space and to which the laws of nature therefore cannot be applied. This seems to meet the definition of a miracle...i.e., "an event not ascribable to human power or the laws of nature."

In any event, the fact that your and my parents were born and met and then had you and me and we are here and alive and that the chance of that happening in this universe is so remote as to be unfathomable, means that you and I are indeed miracles. Don't you think?



In April the Social Concerns Committee collected contributions for the Kids4Peace, (k4p) scholarship fund. Founded in Jerusalem in 2002, k4p is a global movement of youth and families, dedicated to ending conflict and inspiring hope in divided societies around the world. The k4p organization operates international summer camps, leadership programs and a 6-year, year-round program for more than 500 Palestinian, Israeli and North American youth.

The New Hampshire Chapter of k4p is hosting a camp this summer for 7th and 8th grade students of Christian, Muslim, and Jewish faiths. The camp is scheduled for June 28- July 9 at Plymouth State University. Activities will include singing and performing a play at the Flying Monkey Movie House and Performance Center, outdoor games, arts & crafts, interfaith learning including visits to a mosque, synagogue, and church, peace and leadership skill-building. http://www.k4p.org/wp-content/uploads/2013/09/Camp-2017-Final.pdf

Unfortunately, not all of the children who are interested in participating in this program can afford the \$1200 camp tuition. However, k4p maintains a scholarship fund so that no child is ever turned away for lack of ability to pay. This scholarship fund relies on individuals, congregations, and community groups for financial support and thanks to your generosity, KUUF as a congregation, has just donated \$585 to k4p.
